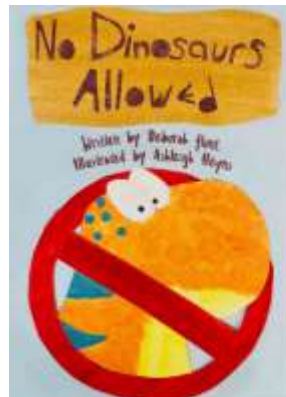

No Dinosaurs Allowed is a story of **friendship** and **acceptance**.

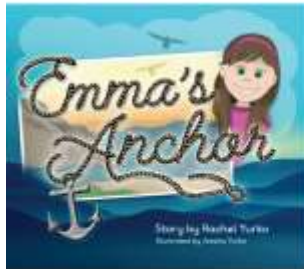
